

AFFIDAVIT FOR WARRANT OF ARREST AND DETENTION

Affiant, Detective Anthony Nelson #3772, is employed by the City of Austin Police Department Homicide Unit and currently assigned as the Lead Investigator in the death investigation of Colton Brandt Turner.

My belief of the foregoing statement is based upon information provided to me by Cedar Park Police Detectives Ricky Pando #1047, Coy Brown #1319, Jason LeMond #875 and Christopher Dailey #1043, Witnesses, Austin-Travis County EMS CAD Report 14255-0175, Austin Fire Department CAD Report 14086908, Cedar Park Police Department Offense Report 1409-0147, Austin Police CAD Report 14-2550137 and Austin Police Department Offense Report 14-2550137.

On 09/10/14, a female identified as Brianna Spieldenner W/F 07/27/94 reported her concern to the Cedar Park Police Department for a child she knew as Colton Brandt Turner W/M 09/21/11. Spieldenner had not seen Colton in some time and had photos of who she knew to be Colton Brandt Turner. These photos depicted Colton with severe bruising to his back and left side of his head. The injuries appeared to be in various stages of healing which suggested continued abuse.

Colton was known to last be in the care of his mother and her boyfriend. The mother was identified as Meagan Rena Work W/F 05/11/94. Meagan's boyfriend was identified as Michael Brandt Turner W/M 02/22/85.

Cedar Park Detectives were able to locate both Meagan and Michael. Meagan was living in a home in Cedar Park, while Michael was located in the San Saba County jail (for a Probation Revocation). Both were interviewed by Cedar Park Detectives. Meagan, who was interviewed first, initially stated that Colton was being cared for by her friend in Sachse, Texas. Police in Sachse were contacted and asked to check the welfare of the child. When Police arrived to the location, the child was not found.

The female at this residence, identified as Lorrie Hatfield W/F 12/19/89, told Police that on 09/05/14 she and Meagan Work had been in contact with one another. Hatfield had offered Meagan the chance for her and Colton to stay with her. Meagan had told Hatfield that Colton was staying with family in East Texas and never took her up on the offer.

With this inconsistency, Police confronted Meagan. She then told Detectives that Colton had been kidnapped while her vehicle was parked in the E. Rundberg area of Austin. Meagan continued by saying Colton was taken from the vehicle along with a purple blanket and her wallet.

With this statement, Cedar Park Investigators were able to gain the assistance of the Texas Rangers and the FBI. Investigators continued their interview with Meagan. During the conversation Meagan continued to be inconsistent with her statements of the kidnapping. When confronted with these issues, Meagan changed her story again.

Meagan was now telling Investigators that she had given Colton to some unknown couple while she was at a fast-food eating establishment. Meagan advised that she gave Colton to a man and woman that had two children of their own. Meagan was unable to give a description of the couple and only a vague description of their vehicle.

Investigators then drove to the San Saba County jail to talk with Michael Brandt Turner. Michael Turner initially told Investigators that Meagan had told him she had given Colton to friends at a fast-food restaurant. Michael said that he trusted Meagan when she told him that she knew the people she had given Colton to. Investigators pointed out some of the small differences in the two individual stories and continued to talk with Michael.

Then during the conversation Michael told Investigators that Colton was in fact deceased and agreed to show them where he was buried, in the Austin area. At this point, the Austin Police Department, to include this Detective, was notified of events.

Michael told Investigators that after Colton died he was wrapped in a purple blanket and buried in approximately 2 to 3 feet in the ground. He then piled wood on top of the grave and laid a piece of sheet rock on top of the wood.

Austin Police Homicide Detective R. Tynes #4415 met the Investigators who drove Michael from San Saba. Michael was able to guide all of the Investigators to a location on Felter Lane, located within Austin, Travis County Texas. When they parked, Michael took Investigators into the wood line to the grave site. The site was found, just as described by Michael.

When I was notified about the find, myself and Cedar Park Lt Chance Thomas drove to the Williamson County jail to talk with Meagan. Meagan had been arrested by the Cedar Park Police Department for Abandoning a Child.

Before interviewing Meagan, I told her what rights she had under Miranda. Meagan told me that she understood and agreed to talk with me. Meagan first told me the same story of giving Colton to an unknown couple at the restaurant. I told Meagan that Michael had actually told us what happened to Colton and even took Police to his location.

Meagan quickly told me that sometime in early July she and Colton were waiting for Michael outside of his place of employment. While waiting, Colton had a seizure. He was not known to have seizures, and with being the first time she didn't know what to do. Meagan said that she yelled for Michael and he came out from the building.

Meagan went on to say that Michael got into the vehicle and drove them back to the motel room they were staying at instead of a hospital. According to Meagan, she and Michael attempted to nurse Colton to health on their own. As they stayed in the room overnight, Meagan said she fell asleep.

When Meagan awoke, she found that Colton was deceased. Rather than calling 911, she and Michael waited until it got dark to bury Colton. Meagan said that she rode with Michael to place Colton in a shallow grave at another location other than the one on Felter Lane. This grave was too shallow because Michael was digging it with only a knife. Meagan said she refused to leave Colton there so they removed him and moved him to the Felter location.

When asked if there would be any signs of injury observed on Colton's body, Meagan advised that he would most likely have a large "bump" on his head from falling down days before. She also noted that there would most likely still be bruising on his body that were from when the pictures were taken. When asked who caused these injuries, Meagan was unable to tell me.

The charges in Williamson County were dropped on Meagan, and she was arrested by Austin Police Personnel and booked into jail for Tampering with Evidence.

I, along with Cedar Park Detective Justin Miller, then drove to San Saba County to talk with Michael Turner again. When I arrived and met Michael, he was read Miranda rights by Detective Miller.

Michael was able to tell me that sometime around July 6th or 7th of this year, he had brought Meagan and Colton to work with him. They both waited inside of the truck behind the building, which was not uncommon. Michael walked into work around 9am and Colton was normal. At about 9:30am, Michael heard Meagan yelling for him outside. Michael ran outside to find that Colton was not breathing normally.

Michael said that he jumped into the vehicle and prepared to drive Colton to the hospital. As he was doing this Meagan told him that they could not take Colton to the hospital because they would "get into trouble and Colton would be taken away from them". Michael and Meagan decided to return to the motel room and "ice Colton's head" because he seemed hot.

Michael, like Meagan, stated that Colton passed away the next morning. Michael stated that after he placed Colton in the first grave, he and Meagan decided that it was too shallow and moved him to the Felter Lane location. Michael said that he was able to obtain a shovel from a man nearby which allowed him to dig the grave deeper.

When asked about injuries observed on Colton, Michael said that he also observed a "bump" on his head. According to Michael, this "bump" was on Colton's head days before his death. When asked what he thought happened to Colton, Michael said that Meagan had to have "done something" to him.

Michael told me that Colton was "his son", even though he knew that he was not the biological father. Michael admitted to being at the hospital when Colton was born and even accepted the child to the point that the boy was given his middle and last name.

On 09/13/14, Meagan Work was brought to the Austin Police Homicide Office for another interview. I again read Meagan her Miranda rights, which she said she understood, and agreed to talk with me.

I told Meagan that an autopsy was performed on her son and asked if she could explain what was observed. Meagan was clear that Colton had died on the morning of July 7th. She however added that on July 6th, Colton had hit his head on an air conditioning unit inside of the motel room as a result of Colton being assaulted. From that point, Colton was unable to walk and was not acting normal.

Meagan went on to say that she had picked Colton up to place him in the vehicle on July 6th so that they could join Michael in getting his check from work. They arrived sometime between 2 and 3 pm on this day. While Michael was inside, Colton began to have issues breathing. Meagan yelled for Michael as he came outside.


According to Meagan, Michael was the one who pointed out that they could not take Colton to the hospital out of fear of arrest. They instead drove back to the motel room. Meagan continued by saying that while in the room, Colton continued to decline. Meagan and Michael both knew that he was getting worse but wanted time to think of the best way of getting help, without getting into trouble. They even thought that they could just drop him off at a hospital, but feared that his DNA would be linked to hers, and then her to Michael.

Meagan went on to say that she fell asleep around 3 or 4 am and woke up in the morning of July 7th when the sun was already up. This was when she found Colton deceased. They waited until later in the day, at almost sundown, to hide Colton's body the first time. Meagan advised she was next to Michael as he was burying the body and assisted him by holding her phone up as a light. It was around midnight when they were finished, but she feared the grave wasn't deep enough. According to Meagan, Michael removed Colton from the grave and placed him in the bed of their truck. They then took the body back to the motel room to wait for the next night.

Meagan went on to say that they slept in the motel room with Colton's body lying on the floor. They stayed in the room until about 6 to 7 pm on July 8th, and then transported the body to Felter Lane. Meagan advised that she did not join Michael in this burial, but it was at her insistence Michael bury the body in a deeper grave.


When asked why she did not call the police after Colton had passed away, Meagan advised that she and Michael both knew that they feared any pending investigation coming from a deceased child.

Affiant believes that there is sufficient probable cause to support the charge of Tampering with Physical Evidence (PC 37.09) including, but not limited to, witness statements and physical evidence which implicates Meagan Rena Work, on or about July 7th, 2014, in Travis County Texas, knowing that an offense had been committed, she altered, destroyed, or concealed Colton Brandt Turner's body, a human corpse, and aided and assisted Michael Brandt Turner in altering, destroying or concealing said corpse, with intent to impair its availability as evidence in any subsequent investigation of or official proceeding related to the offense of Injury to a Child.






